About Goleta Valley Beautiful

Goleta Valley Beautiful is a non-profit organization whose mission is to enhance the beauty and environmental health of the Goleta Valley.

Over the last 38 years, we have planted thousands of trees on publicly-owned land.

We believe that trees are an investment in the future. As part of an urban forest, trees add beauty, provide wildlife habitat, improve air quality, reduce greenhouse gases, and assist with controlling storm water runoff.

Importantly, we water and maintain every tree we plant until it is self-sufficient.

We cultivate native trees from seed in our tree nursery at the Devereux Greenhouse. The use of native trees enhances the long-term sustainability of our plantings.

Goleta Valley Beautiful also does much more:

- Monthly and annual awards to encourage exemplary landscape design and maintenance;
- Tree-oriented educational programs in the schools and in community workshops;
- Training of youth groups, including at-risk youth, in weekly projects involving tree planting and maintenance;
- Removal of graffiti and trash from parks, schools, and roadways;
- Assistance to neighborhood groups in developing beautification projects for their locale; and
- An annual “Heritage Tree & History Tour” with the Goleta Valley Historical Society.

This tree was nominated in an enthusiastic missive from tree-lover Randy Baldwin of San Marcos Growers. Randy has also nominated the tree for recognition as a "California Big Tree" due to its unusually large size: 35 feet tall, 50 foot canopy, and 80 inch trunk circumference at 5 feet high.

This Australian Willow, Geijera Parviflora, is growing in the central courtyard of what is now the Goleta Valley Community Center, the site of the original Goleta Union School built in 1927.

Randy noted that Geijera Parviflora was introduced to the United States in the 1920s, with seeds sent from New South Wales.

This interesting new garden borders UCSB's Student Resource Building.

Using plants and seeds native to the campus, CCBER designed and planted the garden in cooperation with AICRC.

This heritage garden honors the Chumash people, who lived in the region and had a village where UCSB now stands for thousands of years, and how they lived with nature. The interpretive signs give the native usage of, and the Barbareño Chumash word for, each species in the garden.



Sustainable Design

Decades in the making, this lovely garden features numerous California native and edible plants. Sustainable features include a permeable recycled stone driveway, a deck made from

recycled cedar from a water tank, and solar hot water and electricity. An extensive rainwater harvesting system collects 6,000 gallons of rainwater which gravity feed fruit trees and blueberries. The rest of the garden survives on natural rainfall, supplemented by one or two occasional hand-waterings in dry years. A small buffalo-grass lawn provides a play area connecting the house to other property elements, and requires a fraction of the water and maintenance of a conventional lawn.

San Marcos Foothill Coalition



The San Marcos Foothills Preserve is a 200 acre parcel located north of Foothill Road and east of Highway 154, just as one begins driving up toward the San Marcos Pass. The Preserve includes grasslands, wetlands, and Oak Savannah habitats.

The establishment of the Preserve for this magnificent property is the result of years of work by numerous local preservation groups in cooperation with public agencies and Bermant Development Company.

The property was donated to the Trust for Public Land in 2007 and has since been acquired by the County of Santa Barbara.

There is a new trail network, and habitat restoration efforts are currently underway. A County Park is planned.

The San Marcos Foothills Preserve will ensure the preservation and enhancement of the property's habitats and the many species they support, as well as scenic hiking trails and watershed protection.

The 5.4 acre San Clemente Habitat Restoration and Enhancement Project uses an innovative Stormwater

Management System to provide on-site biofiltration and treatment of 100% of storm and irrigation water from the adjacent 11.5 acre San Clemente student housing complex.

The project conserves and enhances vernal pools, and has created grassland, oak woodland, and coastal sage scrub habitat from a formerly degraded, weedy site.

Situated in the heart of the UCSB campus, the Library Plaza is a major campus circulation corridor. The re-designed Plaza, part of a multi-stage master plan, creates a pedestrian-scale environment where students can study, relax, and socialize.

The Plaza features permeable paving, a rain garden, and a bermed lawn with a storm water infiltration gallery. A blend of drought-tolerant Mediterranean and California native plants provide color and serve to slow and filter rainwater.



Expanded outdoor dining area at the Arbor includes new palms with decorative tree grates, and festive umbrellas. New light standards with flags (not shown) help define the circulation corridor within the Plaza.

This year's Community Pride award goes to the Pacifica Suites Hotel, an award winner in the early 1990s.

The gardens and historic Sexton House on the Hotel grounds date back to the 1800s. They have been beautifully preserved and well maintained as part of the hotel operation. The gardens are an important surviving collection of specimen trees and plants from an earlier era when horticulturalists created botanic gardens at their homesteads.

The Pacifica Suites Hotel is recognized for its on-going preservation and maintenance of this piece of Goleta Valley heritage.
